Pafford Place, named after long-time volunteers Gordon and Robbie Pafford, will have nine brand new homes built for nine very deserving families. After building 65 homes in Sumner County over the past 25 years, this groundbreaking is especially significant because it is Habitat's first neighborhood to be built in Sumner County.
